- (b) What is the relevance of Socrates today as a social and moral critic?
- 2. (a) Explain the intrinsic good for evaluation of human conduct in Aristotle's Nichomachean ethics?
- (b) Define virtue and explain its role according to Aristotle!
- (c) Briefly define at least 4 cardinal virtues identified by Aristotle!
- 3. (a) Explain the meaning of hedonism!
- (b) Describe Epicurean hedonism and show how it differs from the hedonism of "over-indulgence"!
- (c) Briefly define: (i) psychological hedonism; (ii) ethical hedonism.
- 4. (a) Demonstrate what stoicism means by it being "virtuous to maintain a will that is in accord with nature"!
- (b) Illustrate what it means in cynicism to "live a life of virtue in accordance with nature"!
- 5. Illustrate what Immanuel Kant meant by the following!
- (a) The good will as the only thing good without qualification;
- (b) Duty as respect for lawfulness;

- (c) The categorical imperative and the universal law of nature.
- 6. (a) Define the general view of utilitarianism and its similarities with Epicureanism!
- (b) Briefly state the utilitarian views of Jeremy Bentham and John Stuart Mill.
